

## Use garden words to practise rhyming

**Subject(s):** Language and Communication

**Grade(s):** 1-2

**Key Stage:** 1

**Learning intention(s):**

Students use garden words to recognise and create rhymes.

**Mapping to curriculum:**

### English

- Read with some understanding familiar texts with prompt and support using phonics and sight words.
- Use features of short texts and illustrations with prompt and support to identify and locate information.
- Engage in reading/viewing a range of texts for pleasure, to improve fluency and to develop a positive attitude towards reading. Write and create representations of a range of information texts for a variety of purposes using words or sentences, text features and multimodal elements.
- Write words, phrases and sentences using taught phonemes, correct letter form and direction, and appropriate spacing of letters in/between words.

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## Lesson Instructions

1. Start by reading some garden-themed rhymes with the class to introduce rhyming. For garden themed rhymes click here:

2. After students recognise rhyming words, brainstorm garden words that rhyme, then create a short class poem together.
3. Here are some rhyming words to help you get started:
  - row – crow
  - bug – slug
  - pick – lick
  - berry – cherry
  - munch – crunch
  - tree – free
4. After writing the class rhyme, make a poster of it to display in the classroom.
